TENSES

DEFINITION

Tense is a form of verb that describes the relation between time and action. It gives time to the action.

There are three types of tenses:

- Past tense
- Present tense
- Future tense

PAST TENSE

The **past tense** is used to describe or indicate an action that began in the past

There are four forms of the past tense.
 They include:

simple past

I worked.

past Continuous

I was working.

past perfect

I had worked.

past perfect continuous

I had been working.

SIMPLE PAST DEFINITION

The past indefinite tense, also known as simple past tense, is used to indicate a **finished or completed** action/task that occurred/happened at **a specific point in time** in the past.

Rules

Affirmative

Subject + V2 (past form of verb) + Object

Ex. I ate rice.

Negative

Subject + did + not + V1 + Object.

Ex. I did not eat rice.

Interrogative

Did + Subject+ V1 + Object+?

Ex. Did I go there?

PAST CONTINUOUSI

DEFINITION

 The Past continuous tense is one used to describe actions that began in the past and continued for short period of time.

Rules

Affirmative

Subject + was / were + main verb+ ing + object

Ex. He was studying in the library.

Negative

Subject + was / were + not + main verb+ ing + object

Ex. You were not studying in the library.

Interrogative

Was / were + Subject + main verb+ ing + Object + ?

Was he studying in the library?

PAST PERFECT DEFINITION

Past perfect tense is used for actions that were completed in the past before another action

took place for unfulfilled desires and impossible tasks.

Rules

Affirmative

Subject + had + V3 (past participle form) + object

Ex. She had finished the test.

Negative

Subject + had + not + V3 (past participle form) + Object

Ex. She had not finished the test.

Interrogative

Had_+ she + V3 (past participle form) + Object
?

Ex. Had she finished the test?

PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS DEFINITION

Past perfect continuous tense is used to express the actions that began at a certain point in the past and continued up to that time.

Rules

Affirmative

- Subject + had + been + main verb+ ing + object+ since/for + time
- Ex. He had been working on this since last month.

Negative

- Subject_+ had + not + been + main verb + ing + object + since/ for + time.
- Ex. I had not been watching the cricket match on television for two hours.

Interrogative

Had_+ Subject + been + main Verb + ing + object + ?

Ex. Had you been doing any work during the last two hours?
