

Assertion-Reasoning Practice

A. Assertion (A): "You should try the new restaurant; it's highly recommended."

Reason (R): The modal "should" is used to give advice or suggestions.

1. Both A and R are true, and R is the correct explanation of A.
2. Both A and R are true, but R is not the correct explanation of A.
3. A is true, but R is false.
4. A is false, and R is true.

B. Assertion (A): "Can" and "could" both express ability, but "could" is also used to indicate polite requests or suggestions.

Reason (R): "Could" is the past tense form of "can," and therefore is used only for past events.

1. Both A and R are true, and R is the correct explanation of A.
2. Both A and R are true, but R is not the correct explanation of A.
3. A is true, but R is false.
4. A is false, and R is true.

C. Assertion (A): In the sentence, "Let's go for a walk, shall we?" the question tag "shall we" is appropriate.

Reason (R): For sentences that start with "Let's," the question tag is typically "shall we."

1. Both A and R are correct, and R is the correct explanation of A.
2. Both A and R are correct, but R is not the correct explanation of A.
3. A is correct, but R is incorrect.
4. A is incorrect, but R is correct.

D. Assertion (A): Assertive sentences can be either positive or negative statements.

Reason (R): Negative sentences cannot be assertive because they contradict a statement rather than asserting it.

1. Both A and R are correct, and R is the correct explanation of A.

2 Both A and R are correct, but R is not the correct explanation of A.

3 A is correct, but R is incorrect.

4 A is incorrect, but R is correct.

E. Assertion (A): In the sentence "The car is parked in front of the house," "in front of" is a prepositional phrase.

Reason (R): A prepositional phrase includes a preposition and the object of the preposition, giving more information about the location.

1. Both A and R are correct, and R is the correct explanation of A.

2 Both A and R are correct, but R is not the correct explanation of A.

3 A is correct, but R is incorrect.

4 A is incorrect, but R is correct.
