Paper Boats

Situation-based questions :

4. Suppose you made a paper boat and it floats away in a village and reaches a small kid. How do you think the kid would react towards the paper boat?

5. Suppose you see an old person trying to cross a bamboo bridge. How would you like to help that person?

6. Suppose you have many colourful papers. You have a group of friends. Discuss and share how you would like to use the colourful papers. It must be a group activity, so you must also respect other people's view.

7. If you were in Meena's place, and you have nothing to help the boy to play. Think and answer how you would help the boy play.

8. Do you know what craft work made of paper is called? Can you suggest some craft work you can make with paper?

9. You should be careful while playing by the side of a stream. Discuss the reason parents suggest being careful while playing by the side of river or water.

10. In the story of Paper Boats, the word delighted was used. Share your moment where you felt delighted.
