TOAD	FROG
Dry, bumpy, and warty skin	Smooth, moist, and slippery skin
Prefer dryer environments closer to land	Love wet or damp habitats near water
Shorter hind legs, resulting in hopping rather than leaping	Long, powerful hind legs for leaping distances
Lay eggs in long chains	Lay eggs in clusters or masses
Have parotoid glands behind eyes that produce a toxic substance as defense	Generally lack parotoid glands, may have other toxic skin secretions
Tend to walk rather than jump	Known for their strong, acrobatic jumps
Often have a more rounded body shape	Usually have a sleek, narrow body
Can survive in a wider range of environments, including deserts	Generally require a moist environment to survive

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
